Dear Chair La Rosa:

As the President and Co-Owner of Sterling Fibers - a manufacturing company in Santa Rosa County - I am writing you to ask the Florida Public Service Commission to deny Florida Power and Light's (FPL) petition for rate increase, Docket 20250011.

At Sterling Fibers, we manufacture specialty acrylic fibers used in industrial applications including friction materials, filtration, and gaskets. We are a global company, with more than 70% of our sales overseas in very cost-conscious industries, including automotive.

When I started working at this site for our predecessor company in 1989, our "all in" electric rate was \$0.042/kwh. Our "all in" rate for 2024 was \$0.141/kwh. Our specific rate in the petition for increase is going up more than 30% and based on information supplied to us by our FPL representative, our "all in" cost is expected to increase by 20% to \$0.169/kwh.

This is an increase of 236% from 1989 to 2024 and an increase of 302% from 1989 to 2026. For reference, the Consumer Price Index from 1989 to 2025 has only gone up by 162%. Additionally, our major product in the automotive market has only increased by 47% over the same period, demonstrating that costs can be controlled when market conditions require it. FPL's rate is already significantly higher than it should be and to increase it any more will cause manufacturing companies in Florida, such as Sterling Fibers, to become uncompetitive in the global market. This will force us to consider difficult decisions, including moving our production out of state or even overseas.
