Rates effective with August 2025 bills Important information about changes to Duke Energy Florida's rates

Duke Energy Florida is delivering on its commitment to provide cleaner, smarter energy solutions to benefit all Florida customers.

Duke Energy Florida filed with the Florida Public Service Commission (FPSC) to recover costs associated with the Sundance Solar Renewable Energy Center in Madison County, Fla.

At peak output, each of the four 74.9-megawatt solar sites will generate enough electricity to power the equivalent of approximately 23,000 homes, while displacing 1.2 million cubic feet of natural gas, 15,000 barrels of fuel oil and 12,000 tons of coal annually.

This is part of Duke Energy Florida's plan to add a total of 12 new solar sites, adding 900 MW of cost-effective solar facilities within the state by year-end 2028.

If approved by the FPSC, the impact to residential customer rates will be 48 cents per 1,000 kWh. The Sundance Renewable Energy Center is expected to serve customers starting in July 2025 and will be reflected in customers' August 2025 bills. The residential bill will be \$179.09 per month for a residential customer who uses 1,000 kWh.
