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Dear Florida Public Service Commission,

I'm writing to demand that you REJECT Florida Power & Light Company's proposed rate increase (Docket No. 20250011). This is purely CORPORATE GREED!!!

FPL is requesting nearly \$10 billion in new charges over the next four years — costs that will fall on the backs of the very people who rely on FPL to keep the lights on. Half of every dollar in this proposal would go straight to shareholder profits, not essential services, repairs Or strengthening the grid. That's UNACCEPTABLE!!!!!!

In the last five years alone, FPL customers have seen their bills jump by more than \$400 a year. This latest plan would add another \$360 in just two years – all while Floridians are still recovering from devastating storms, battling the rising cost of living and dealing with increasing HEAT.

FPL claims the hike is needed to meet demand, but the Office of Public Counsel has made it clear " THIS IS MISLEADING". According to OPC, FPL's numbers are INFLATED — and rather than ask to raise rates, the company should be asking to ACTUALLY CUT RATES by \$620.5 million in 2026.

The Public Service Commission is charged with protecting the public — not maximizing utility profits. I strongly urge you to reject this rate hike and send a clear message that Floridians come first.
