Honorable Governor Desantis and Florida Public service Commission:

I am sending this email to you as a Florida Power and Light consumer to object to the rate increase that has been filed by Florida Power and Light/Nextera Energy and or their subsidiaries. They are using our funds from Florida electric consumers to lease prime farmland in multiple counties in Indiana for solar panel farms. They are purchasing these 25-year leases from farmers on these prime, productive farms that have the capability of growing over 200 bushels to the acre of corn to build these solar panel farms. In Indiana, the effective rate of producing electricity from these solar farms is less than 3 percent due to the lack of continuous daylight hours, with a yearly average of 5.1 hours per day, and the likelihood of snow covering the panels during the winter. They are requesting a rate increase for the next 4 years, which many consumers will not be able to afford.
