- The TCC chancellor is not allowing revisions to be presented by the JCC (joint consultation committee) regarding the Faculty Association and the Faculty Trustees. She has said there is no deadline. That is incorrect.
- Without presenting and implementing the required revisions, the Faculty Association and the Faculty Senate will be dissolved on Sept. 1, 2025. This is and especially our more conservative members
- Faculty and staff cannot contact the Board for fear of termination

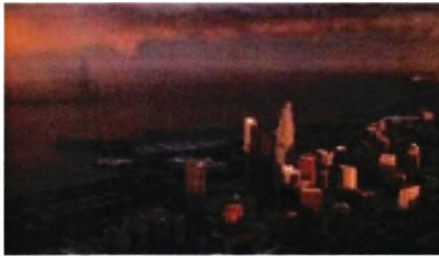
