I am writing as a consumer regarding the rate increases FPL has requested. I have watched the debates and the online discussions regarding this request and am writing to urge you to please look carefully at the rate that FPL proposed and especially the second proposal that was written with large businesses in mind. I do not believe the rate increases are warranted nor reflect the best for Floridians including myself and I ask that you reject these rate increases and require a more measured and lower approach.

One of the main things that is overlooked in this is the increase in the minimal cost for connectivity. FPL hates when consumers conserve energy or supply their own, such as solar. To discourage that behavior they are loading up the first 100kWH with excessive fees and rate increases so that even if we conserve energy, they get a large payment from us. This rate increase accelerates that first 100-1000kWH cost increase and punishes those who are working to save money and prefer to control what spending variables they can.

I urge you as commissioners who are supposed to watch out for the welfare of Floridians to reject the proposal and its onerous burden it lays on the connection fee and low-energy users. One option is to increase the rate on the second tier of energy users, who are also more likely to be able to afford it. Make the majority of the rate increase apply to the 1001st kWH and beyond and then FPL can have its money and also encourage large homes and businesses to implement more energy-efficient elements and behavior.
