**FLORIDA POWER & LIGHT COMPANY'S
REQUEST FOR CONFIDENTIAL CLASSIFICATION OF
MATERIALS PROVIDED PURSUANT TO AUDIT CONTROL NO. 2025-037-1-1**

Pursuant to Section 366.093, Florida Statutes (“F.S.”) and Rule 25-22.006, Florida Administrative Code (“F.A.C.”), Florida Power & Light Company (“FPL”) requests confidential classification of certain material provided to the Staff of the Florida Public Service Commission (“Staff”) pursuant to Audit Control No. 2025-037-1-1 (“the Audit”). In support of this request, FPL states as follows:

1. During the course of the Audit, FPL provided Staff with various confidential documents. By letter dated September 9, 2025, Staff indicated its intent to retain certain audit work papers pertaining to the Audit. In accordance with Rule 25-22.006(3)(a), F.A.C., FPL has 21 days from the date of the letter to file a formal request for confidential classification with respect to the work papers. Accordingly, FPL files this Request for Confidential Classification to maintain continued confidential handling of the confidential work papers.

2. The following exhibits are included with and made a part of this request:

a. Exhibit A consists of a copy the documents which FPL claims to be confidential, on which all information that is entitled to confidential treatment under Florida law has been highlighted.

b. Exhibit B consists of a copy of the confidential documents, on which all the information that is entitled to confidential treatment under Florida law has been redacted.

c. Exhibit C is a table containing an identification of the information highlighted in Exhibit A by page and line. Exhibit C also references the specific statutory base(s) for the claim of confidentiality and identifies the declarant who supports the requested classification.

d. Exhibit D is the declaration of Jarvis Van Norman in support of this Request.

3. FPL submits that the highlighted information in Exhibit A is proprietary confidential business information within the meaning of Section 366.093(3), F.S. This information is intended to be and is treated by FPL as private, and its confidentiality has been maintained. Pursuant to Section 366.093, such information is entitled to confidential treatment and is exempt from the disclosure provisions of the public records law. Thus, once the Commission determines that the information in question is proprietary confidential business information, the Commission is not required to engage in any further analysis or review such as weighing the harm of disclosure against the public interest in access to the information.

4. As described more fully in the declaration included as Exhibit D, the highlighted portions of the documents in Exhibit A contain information concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of FPL to contract for goods or services on favorable terms. Specifically, the documents include invoices and amounts billed by vendors to FPL for goods and services. This information is protected by Sections 366.093(3)(d), F.S.

5. Pursuant to Section 366.093(4), F.S., the information for which confidential classification is granted remains protected from disclosure up to 18 months unless good cause is shown to grant protection from disclosure for a longer period. Currently, the Commission retains audit reports for period of seven years at which time the audit materials are returned to FPL unless

Commission staff or another affected person requests that these audit materials continue to be retained. The nature of these materials will not change in the next three years. Therefore, to promote administrative efficiency, FPL requests confidential classification for a period of thirty-six (36) months. Upon a finding by the Commission that the confidential workpapers that are the subject of this Request are proprietary and confidential business information, the information should not be declassified for a thirty-six (36) month period and should be returned to FPL as soon as it is no longer necessary for the Commission to conduct its business. See Section 366.093(4), F.S.

WHEREFORE, for the above and foregoing reasons, as more fully set forth in the supporting materials, Florida Power & Light Company respectfully requests that its Request for Confidential Classification be granted.


DECLARATION OF JARVIS VAN NORMAN

1. My name is Jarvis Van Norman. I am currently employed by Florida Power & Light Company ("FPL") as Financial and Planning Lead, Power Generation Business Services. I have personal knowledge of the matters stated in this written declaration.

2. I have reviewed the documents referenced and incorporated in FPL's Request for Confidential Classification of Materials Provided Pursuant to Audit No. 2025-037-1-1 for which I am identified as a declarant. The documents which are asserted by FPL to be proprietary confidential business information contain or constitute information concerning bids or other contractual data, the disclosure of which would impair the efforts of FPL to contract for goods or services on favorable terms. Specifically, the information contains invoices and amounts paid to vendors. This information is subject to non-disclosure obligations. To the best of my knowledge, FPL has maintained the confidentiality of this information.

3. Therefore, consistent with the provisions of the Florida Administrative Code, such materials should remain confidential for a period of thirty-six (36) months.
