A financial industry insider blew the whistle on the solar energy company Sunnova, filing a 22-page memo with the IRS in May 2023 that

accused the company of reporting a "massively higher" number of rooftop solar systems to the feds than to investors in an attempt to secure taxpayer funding. Months later, the Biden administration approved Sunnova for a \$3 billion loan guarantee intended to finance an expansion of rooftop solar panels into low-income areas. The company is now bankrupt.

The stunning series of events "raises questions about whether the Biden administration ignored warning signs about the solar panel company while promoting it as a major partner in its green energy agenda," our Alana Goodman reports. There were plenty of warning signs: The whistleblower uncovered tens of thousands of "hidden" cells in a quarterly spreadsheet Sunnova published online that allegedly directed the company's analysts to include customers who purchased solar batteries in its count of customers who purchased entire systems.

The Trump administration canceled Sunnova's loan agreement. "Sunnova filed for bankruptcy in June, months after warning investors that it had run out of money."
