5	preliminary matters we need to address before we
6	get to the draft Prehearing Order?
7	MR. MARQUEZ: Good morning. Not to our
8	knowledge, Commissioner Passidomo Smith.
9	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO SMITH: All right.
10	Seeing none, let's proceed to the draft Prehearing
11	Order.
12	Section I, Case Background.
13	Section II, Conduct of Proceedings.
14	Section III, Jurisdiction.
15	Section IV, Procedure for Handling

17	Section V, Prefiled Testimony and Exhibits.
18	Staff.
19	MR. MARQUEZ: Staff suggests that the
20	testimony of any witness who is not excused from
21	the hearing should be limited to three minutes.
22	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO SMITH: Objections?
23	Seeing none, three minutes, then.
24	Order of Witnesses.
25	MR. MARQUEZ: If the parties and staff are

1	willing to excuse witnesses, staff will confirm
2	with each Commissioner that the witnesses may be
3	excused. If no Commissioner has any question for
4	those witnesses, then the witnesses should be
5	excused from the hearing with his or her testimony
6	entered into the record as though read and exhibits
7	entered.
8	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO SMITH: All right.
9	Anything else before, so move to Basic Positions.
10	Do the parties have any changes to their basic
11	positions?
12	MS. BAKER: Yes, Commissioner. Apologies, I
13	already spoke with Mr. Marquez about this, but PCS
14	may have a slight revision on ours. We will get it
15	before COB today to staff. And that's actually
16	true in all of the dockets that we have intervened
17	in, just a very slight clarification. Thanks.
18	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO SMITH: Thank you.
19	MR. MARQUEZ: Commissioner, FPL, OPC and FIPUG
20	notified staff of changes to certain positions.
21	Those edits should be reflected in the Prehearing
22	Order that is before the parties today.
23	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO SMITH: Okay.
24	MR. MARQUEZ: Staff also recommends that Your
25	Honor give the parties the opportunity to submit

1	any changes to positions in writing by the close of
2	business tomorrow, October 22nd.
3	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO SMITH: Okay. It
4	sounds like you guys already got it done, but you
5	have until tomorrow if any other amendments need to
6	be made.
7	All right. So we will no other issues, all
8	right, we are going to move to Issues and Positions
9	then.
10	MR. MARQUEZ: Issues and Positions are
11	included in the draft Prehearing Order.
12	For issues in which a party has taken into
13	position at this time, if that party does not take
14	a position on those issues, per the OEP, that
15	position will be reflected as no position in the
16	Prehearing Order.
17	If a party fails to take a position on an
18	issue by the time set, then that party waives their
19	opportunity to conduct cross-examination on that
20	issue, as well as file post-hearing briefs on that
21	matter.
22	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO SMITH: Related matters
23	that need to be discussed?
24	MS. BAKER: Yes, Commissioner. Just, again,
25	very quickly. We have very slight edits. I have

1	already spoken with Mr. Marquez, and we are getting
2	it sorted out
3	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO SMITH: Okay.
4	MS. BAKER: on our positions on Issues 1
5	through 9, I believe.
6	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO SMITH: Okay.
7	MS. BAKER: Thank you.
8	COMMISSIONER PASSIDOMO SMITH: I appreciate
9	you working with staff. Thank you.
10	MS. BAKER: Thank you.
