I am writing to formally express my concern and objection regarding the ongoing and significant electric rate increases approved for Tampa Electric Company (TECO). As a Florida resident and customer, I am deeply concerned & about the financial strain these hikes are placing on households and businesses throughout the state.

Over the past couple of years, customers have seen their bills rise sharply with little relief or justification beyond general statements about fuel costs or infrastructure improvements.

3. Prioritize consumer protection, ensuring that essential services remain affordable for all Floridians.

Thank you for your time and attention to this matter. I trust the Commission will act in the best interest of the people of Florida by holding utilities accountable and preventing unnecessary financial hardship.
