RE: Answers to proposed amendment of rules 25-30-115

1. Referring to draft rule 25-30.115, F.A.C., lines 15-20 states that a copy of the updated version of USOA can be purchased online via NARUC's website. The NARUC website indicates the publication cost is \$30.
