**PETITION FOR APPROVAL OF ENVIRONMENTAL
COST RECOVERY CLAUSE ACTUAL/ESTIMATED
TRUE-UP FOR 2026 AND NEW ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS**

Florida Power & Light Company (“FPL”) hereby petitions the Florida Public Service Commission (“Commission”) for approval of its Actual/Estimated Environmental Cost Recovery Clause (“ECRC”) true-up over-recovery amount of \$5,681,995, including interest, for the period January 2026 through December 2026. Additionally, FPL petitions the Commission for approval of two new environmental projects, the Per- and Polyfluoroalkyl Substances (“PFAS”) Project (“PFAS Project”) and the Eagle Permit Compliance Project, such that prudent costs incurred after the date of this petition may be recovered as “environmental compliance costs” through the ECRC. In support of this petition, FPL incorporates the prepared written testimony and exhibit of FPL witnesses Richard L. Hume and Michael Sole.

1. Section 366.8255, Florida Statutes, authorizes the Commission to review and approve the recovery of prudently incurred environmental compliance costs.

2. Pursuant to Order No. PSC-2026-0049-PCO-EI, FPL hereby files its 2026 ECRC Actual/Estimated testimony and exhibits.

3. FPL’s Actual/Estimated true-up over-recovery for the period January 2026 through December 2026, including interest, is \$5,681,995 as set forth in FPL witness Hume’s testimony and exhibit. The over-recovery amount of \$5,681,995 is added to the 2025 final net true up over-recovery of \$15,962,579 identified in witness Hume’s March 31, 2026 testimony filed in this docket. The net amount will result in an estimated net over-recovery of \$21,644,574.

4. FPL has included actual costs for the period January through May 2026 and updated estimates for June through December 2026. The calculation of the Actual/Estimated true-up amount for the period January 2026 through December 2026 is contained in Commission Schedules 42-1E through 42-9E, which are attached as Exhibit RLH-2 to witness Hume's testimony.

5. The testimony of witness Sole describes and supports the two new projects proposed for ECRC approval. The first, the PFAS Project, is required to facilitate compliance with: (i) the United States Environmental Protection Agency's National Primary Drinking Water Regulation for PFAS, codified at 40 C.F.R. Parts 141 and 142, which establishes enforceable drinking water standards and monitoring requirements for six PFAS compounds; and (ii) Florida's recently enacted restrictions on the use and possession of PFAS-containing aqueous film-forming foam ("AFFF"), which are now codified in Sections 376.911 and 403.086 of the Florida Statutes. Consistent with the newly applicable federal standards, the PFAS Project will include sampling, monitoring, laboratory analysis, reporting, evaluation of potable water treatment systems, and implementation of alternative potable water sources where necessary. Separately, to comply with Florida's new restrictions on PFAS-containing AFFF, FPL must identify and replace certain PFAS-containing fire suppression systems at affected facilities.

6. The new Eagle Permit Compliance Project described in witness Sole's testimony is required to facilitate compliance with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Eagle General Permit requirements established pursuant to the Bald and Golden Eagle Protection Act and its implementing regulations, 50 C.F.R. §§ 22.210 and 22.260. The project will allow FPL to obtain and maintain an Eagle General Permit authorizing certain incidental eagle take associated with operation of electric utility infrastructure as long as the Company implements measures designed

to reduce the risk of eagle injury and mortality. Project activities include updating FPL's Avian Protection Plan, updating avian habitat risk models, establishing a baseline inventory of eagle-risk poles, developing proactive and reactive retrofit strategies, implementing data collection and quality assurance processes, enhancing project-design systems to track avian-safe construction standards, conducting compliance monitoring, supporting required audits and reporting, and administering the permit.

7. FPL submits that the costs for both new projects satisfy the three-part test for ECRC eligibility set forth in Order No. PSC-94-0044-FOF-EI because they are required to comply with environmental laws, regulations, permit conditions, or other governmental requirements and consist of activities undertaken to achieve and maintain such compliance.¹ Further details are included in the prepared testimony of FPL witness Michael Sole.

WHEREFORE, FPL respectfully requests the Commission approve its ECRC Actual/Estimated true-up over-recovery amount of \$5,681,995, including interest, for the period January 2026 through December 2026. Additionally, FPL respectfully requests that the Commission approve the PFAS Project and Eagle Permit Compliance Project as "environmental

¹ Order No. PSC-94-0044-FOF-EI states:

Upon petition, we shall allow the recovery of costs associated with an environmental compliance activity through the environmental cost recovery factor if:

1. such costs were prudently incurred after April 13, 1993;
2. the activity is legally required to comply with a governmentally imposed environmental regulation enacted, became effective, or whose effect was triggered after the company's last test year upon which rates are based; and,
3. such costs are not recovered through some other cost recovery mechanism or through base rates.

compliance activities,” such that prudent costs incurred by FPL in connection with the projects after the date of this petition may be recovered through the ECRC.
