Continued investment in fossil fuel infrastructure does the opposite, but ratepayers like me are being forced to fund it.

WE EXPECT you to:

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- 3) Stop letting FP&L and Duke Energy rely so heavily on gas plants and hand us the bill when fuel prices spike
- 4) Set aggressive, binding targets for solar and energy efficiency measures that lower costs for Floridian families

None of this is experimental or requires waiting. What it requires is leadership — and the political will to prioritize ratepayers over shareholders. Floridians are watching, you work for us!
