CUSTOMER COMMENTS

In regard to the proposed rate increase by Chesapeake Utilities
for Florida City Gas customers, an increase of 24.29% is
unconscionable. My income increases by less than 3% per year.
I am the sole breadwinner supporting my household. 24.29% is too
much. Over the last three years the cost of living in Brevard County
Florida has increased by 10-15%, per a report by News Brevard. Incomes
have increased only 2-3%. for Florida City Gas rates to increase
by 24% is too much and exacerbates the hardships already
being felt by families.
